

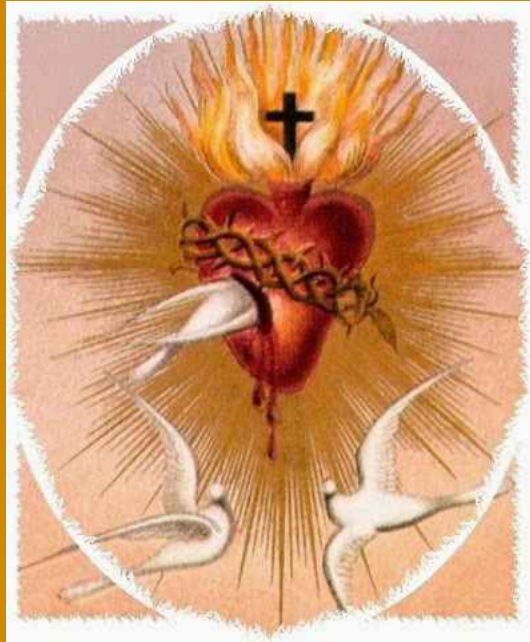

Third Sunday in Ordinary Time January 27, 2019

Marriages: This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

From Father Doug:

During a discussion the other day our conversation drifted to talking about sin. OK, it was at our book study group, but think about how little we talk about sin? It's almost as if Vatican II eliminated sin in most peoples' minds. And so we don't scare our children, any discussion of sin is virtually eliminated from the CCD books. In fact, I was assisting with 1st Penance at an unnamed parish, and the first penitent came in and said "Bless me Father, these are my unloving choices." I didn't know whether to laugh or cry. I suppose then there are venial unloving choices and mortal unloving choices. It's no wonder that each Saturday if the priest hears 3 confessions it's a great day.

In the new Roman Liturgy confusion has continued. The Penitential Rite at the beginning of Mass is not Sacramental Confession and Absolution. There are three forms. The first we all know as the old *Confiteor*, "I confess to Almighty God...." This is followed by a reassurance of forgiveness by the priest and then one of the most ancient parts of the liturgy, the *kyrie eleison*, Lord have mercy. It is so ancient it is the only part of the Mass that survives in Greek not Latin thus going back to earliest days.

The Mass offers a second option, a two-line dialogue about sin and forgiveness, the reassurance of pardon and again the Kyrie.

Priest: Have mercy on us, O Lord.

All: For we have sinned against you.

Priest: Show us, O Lord, your mercy.

All: And grant us your salvation.

Shorter than the First Option, the same message is conveyed. While the Third form consists of three acclamations of praise, some of which have a slightly penitential nuance, but certainly convey something very different from the first two forms. I try to always use one of the first two forms, unless the choir is singing the third form.

It used to be a tradition that before sleep a quick reflection of the day and its failings called an examination of conscience. It's a good habit. Looking at the world around us there is a great deal of sin. We can only change ourselves, but that's a great step toward the peace of the world.

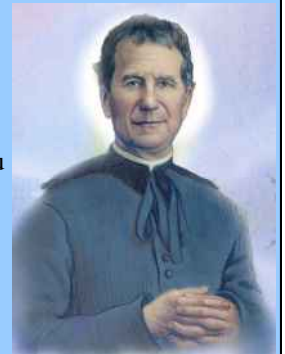

The holidays are well behind us; the year stretches out ahead. And what sort of year will it be? To judge by the words of Jesus in today's Gospel, it will be "a year acceptable to the Lord." And Jesus surely didn't mean only the next three hundred sixty-five days facing his listeners at that time.

When Jesus announced the "arrival" of God's favor, it was a message for all time, for every year. Similarly, we read today in Nehemiah how the people gathered with solemnity to hear God's word as though for the first time. They listened, and then fell to the ground and wept. But the prophet said, "Today is holy . . . do not be sad, and do not weep."

The "year acceptable to the Lord" is this year. The day that is "holy" is this day. The time to listen is now. What sort of year will you have? What sort of day? God's help is always here. What you do with each day can be holy and acceptable to the Lord if you but listen to and act on God's word.

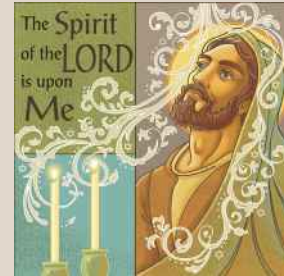
TODAY'S READINGS
