Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time February 17, 2019

Marriages: This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Funerals: Please call the Rectory.





From Father Doug:

Both parishes received thank you notes recently for donations, hospitality, some of our volunteers who do great work in the community and beyond. The number of gifts for Christmas was overwhelming, and the thank you notes reflected the gratitude of many.

People often say that the Church is always asking for money, and you know that in a couple of weeks will come the Annual Catholic, formerly the Bishop's Annual Appeal. It breaks my heart that I have to say again that none of the money collected from appeals goes to the settling of abuse lawsuits. Hopefully the news is coming this week that former Cardinal McCarrick will be defrocked, that is, returned to being a layman. The Grand Jury reports are disturbing, yet they provide some good news. The number of new cases since 2002 is very small. What we are learning is about the clandestine operations of some Bishops in hiding abuse. I hope this will be eased by an aggressive response from the upcoming Synod of Bishops dealing with the crisis.

Back to the feeling that the Church always asking for money. So did Jesus. One thing we continue to do well, in response to His call is that the Catholic Church is still the largest provider of social services. We are the arms and legs of Jesus in the world. Even this is becoming difficult as the values of the world continue to oppose us and things like health care and adoption services are a challenge to provide while being true to our values as Catholics. We continue to serve around the corner and around the globe and do it very well. God always brings good out of evil. Yes, we need a time of some painful looking back before we can begin a time of looking forward to an exciting new time in the life of the Church.



FEBRUARY 17, 2019
SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

BLESSED

When we think of the word “Beatitude” we think of today’s discourse from Luke’s Gospel, or the more familiar one from Matthew (which begins “Blessed are the poor in spirit . . .”). Actually, beatitudes occur throughout the prophets and Gospels. Today in Jeremiah (with an echo in the psalm) we hear, “Blessed is the one who trusts in the Lord” (Jeremiah 17:7). Following his resurrection in John’s Gospel, Christ proclaims, “Blessed are those who have not seen and have believed” (John 20:29). The evangelists placed these sayings throughout the Gospels as short reminders about the characteristics that one will find in a follower of Christ, characteristics that will help spread the Good News in this life and lead to eternal blessings in the next. In Latin, the saints are called the *Beati*, the “Blessed,” for they are the ones who lived the “blessed” life as described by Jesus throughout the Gospels. How blest are we, when we also strive to make our own days a living beatitude!


TODAY’S READINGS
