## Fifth Sunday of Easter May 19, 2019

**Marriages:** This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of serious spiritual preparation. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other details particularly reception facilities.

**Baptisms:** The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children attend a Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

**Anointing of the Sick:** This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.



*From Father Doug:*

One of the most important ministries in the Church is that of Catechesis, the Christian formation and education that goes on throughout life. We are grateful to Father Joe for his discussion group on Fridays in Lent at St. Pio. Deacon John's Faith Sharing group on Wednesdays at St. Pio is an opportunity for the group to grow by sharing their experiences and studying the Sunday readings. Also on Wednesdays at Sacred Heart I lead a discussion group which is an informal opportunity to look at Scripture and how it applies to the present. Our Deacon-aspirant Dr. Turro has led two Scripture study series.

The catechesis of children is equally important. There have been some changes as we have merged the CCD programs at St. Pio and Sacred Heart. In previous years there was a significant number of children at St. Pio from the Latino community in Seaside Heights. Last summer two new priests who are both bilingual were assigned there. They began to offer classes at different times, they now have catechists who speak Spanish, and they began observing the Feast Days and customs of the community. As part of the Faith in our Future initiative St. Junipero Serra Parish in Seaside will be designated as a center for Hispanic Ministry by the Diocese of Trenton, which in reality it already has become. This past year at St Pio there were roughly 15 students which is not enough to maintain a program. Some grades had only one child. It is important to know that no one was "forced to go back to St. Junipero Serra" as some are saying. Their needs are now far better met, and there is a strong sense of community there for all generations.

In September there will be one program at Sacred Heart for the children of St. Pio and Sacred Heart. John "Pags" Paglione is the Coordinator of Religious Education. St. Pio parishioners are welcome and encouraged to consider being catechists in our merged program. The demographics of St. Pio show that there simply are very few children in our parish area, but joining with Sacred Heart both parish communities will be enhanced by more students in our program.



**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Frequent fliers today have many ways to accrue air miles, so one doesn't always have to endure long hours in cramped seats to earn free hours in cramped seats. In St. Paul's day, there were no such perks, nor would there have been any legal system for him to protest the shipwrecks he endured.



He had other rewards in mind. The churches that he established in the catalogue of cities from today's first reading must have been very different from one another. Language, culture, customs, religious history, obstacles to community, social challenges, the places where they met, their clothing, their bread and wine, all distinct, particular to the area.

There were social customs as well: in a Christian household, the only place where a slave would be able to stand legally as an equal with the master would be at the table of the Lord, because at that table a new world of reconciliation was imaged. While Paul revered local customs, he was relentless about challenging the ways that people lived their Christian lives and how their worship reflected them. It is much the same today, as a global Catholic Church seeks to respect local customs and culture, allowing for differences in many things, yet always giving expression to the underlying presence of Christ, who binds us all together into his body.
