



The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ June 23, 2019

Marriages: This great sacrament is a joyous time, but also a time of serious spiritual preparation. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation.

Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other details particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend a Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Funerals: Please call the Rectory.





From Father Doug:


One of the most important ministries any parish has is the Religious Education program offered for children. Handing down the truth of our faith, preparing the young to receive the Sacraments, and forming their moral and spiritual lives; these are extremely important tasks. Along with the parents who are the first and most important teachers of the faith, we provide the foundation that is, or should be, the basis for everything else these young people learn. It isn't always that way.

While no one can be denied the sacraments, it is also very important that people be fully prepared and properly disposed to receive them. That means that they must have a command of the basic teachings of the Church, they must be regular in attending Mass, and they must show a desire to receive the Sacrament rather than simply be in a certain grade. I am excited, but not unaware of the challenges, that merging out two separate programs into one program will bring. Some parents may not welcome the change. Many others I am sure will be glad to learn that we are going to have more students in the classes, particularly for St. Pio, and this provides a better learning experience. Our teachers volunteer their time. Most are not professional teachers; they are simply people who very generously donate their time to what can sometimes be a thankless ministry. I want to set it straight that they are very much appreciated and will be supported in this new way of doing things. It is vital that they are given an opportunity where they will learn the faith in order to prepare them for life as practicing Catholic Christians. There are few things more gratifying than seeing young minds and hearts open up to God and His people and begin to be young Catholics who love their faith. Our kids deserve the best we can offer, but we will need the help of the parents to bring this about. I hope I can count on everyone's cooperation, so that our Religious Education program can thrive and be strengthened by becoming a joint endeavor. If it is Your holy will, please grant our requests.


Most holy body and blood of Christ, grant us the sacred mysteries so that we may know the grace of Your redemption.

HISTORICAL FACTS OF SACRED HEART CHURCH



- Due to property restrictions prohibiting the building of a church in Mantoloking on December 9, 1913, the Church of the Sacred Heart was established.
- A resolution signed on April 7, 1914, provided for the erection of a church building, not to exceed the cost of \$6,200.00. The construction contract was awarded to J. Stillwell, the lowest bidder.
- The Church was completed in time for the summer season of 1914 and was serviced by the Conventual Franciscan Fathers as a mission of St. Peter's Church in Pt. Pleasant until 1915 when it was placed in the care of Fr. Daniel Lutz, OFM Conv., who took up residence in Bay Head.
- On June 11, 1916, Charles Lincoln Walters was the first baby baptized at Sacred Heart.
- On September 22, 1916 William Cornelius McIntyre and Cleo Honickel were married, having the first wedding performed at Sacred Heart.
- In March 1927, Sacred Heart moved to its current location and was 200 x 314 feet and cost \$12,000.00.
- Fr. Douglas Freer is the 14th Pastor of Sacred Heart *Please pray for the continued success of our Church!*

**THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD
OF CHRIST**
JUNE 23, 2019

THIS SACRED MEAL

Today we celebrate the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Each of the readings includes a blessing and a sharing of food. They remind us of the central place of meals in our lives. Each meal brings to mind other meals: the sharing of cookies and milk, pizza and beer, loaves and fishes, bread and wine. When we prepare a meal for our family, our friends, even strangers, we always put something of ourselves into the preparation and the meal itself. The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ reminds us of what God put into the preparation for this meal that we celebrate today. We share this sacred meal and are transformed as we remember the death of Jesus and the sacrifice that nurtures our faith, sustains our lives, and supports our work.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

We owe today's beautiful feast to a valiant woman who suffered a great deal to establish a feast out of her love for the Eucharist. Juliana was a nun in Belgium in the thirteenth century. She served in a hospital for lepers. She became convinced through her prayer that the liturgical year was incomplete because it had no feast for the Eucharist. Her efforts were not welcome, and a supervising priest sought to punish her for promoting a feast that "nobody wanted." He even had her accused of financial mismanagement and banished her from her convent.

Shortly after she was exiled, the bishop approved the feast. It quickly spread through Europe. In those days, people very seldom received Holy Communion, and so the processions through the streets with the eucharistic bread not only led to an awareness of Christ's hunger to be with us, but prepared the way for a deeper desire to receive Christ's Body and Blood in more frequent Communion. The feast grew rapidly, but Juliana disappeared into poverty and a hidden life. She ended her days as an " anchoress," a woman living in seclusion in a room attached to a parish church. Imagine her delight at seeing us gathered at the table of the Lord on this day, aware of Christ's presence in our midst, sharing fully in Christ's Body and Blood. Our celebration today invests her struggle and sorrows with dignity and meaning.

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — Melchizedek brought out bread and wine and blessed Abram (Genesis 14:18-20).

Psalm — You are a priest forever, in the line of Melchizedek (Psalm 110).

Second Reading — Paul gives his description of the institution of the Eucharist (1 Corinthians 11:23-26).

Gospel — Jesus spoke to the crowd about the kingdom of God and then fed them with five loaves and two fish (Luke 9:11b-17).
