



Marriages: This wonderful sacrament is a joyous time, but also a rewarding spiritual journey. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek that you both flourish the second day and beyond. We are happy to accompany you on your journey. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, are required and individual visits with your priest or deacon will also assist you in your preparation. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other details particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend a Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Funerals: Please call the Rectory.

From Father Doug:

Ave Maris Stella (Hail Star of the Sea)

Hail, bright star of ocean, God's own Mother blest, Ever sinless Virgin, Gate of heavenly rest.

Taking that sweet Ave which from Gabriel came, Peace confirm within us, Changing Eva's name.....

The Blessed Mother is known by many titles. Most of them are found in the Litany of Loreto, which used to be well known among the faithful. One of the most beautiful, at least for us in this part of the world, is Our Lady Star of the Sea or Ocean. It comes from an ancient hymn attributed to St. Bernard of Clairvaux (feast August 20) who is one of my favorite saints.

The Eastern Churches have a tradition on some Marian Feasts where the priest throws a cross into the water and the men of the village dive in to find it. The one who finds it receives great blessings. Not bad in the beautiful waters of the Aegean Sea in Greece, but in the waters of northern Russia, that is a true act of devotion.

In the Latin Church we cast flowers into the Sea in Our Lady's honor, so it is not only in May that we bring flowers to the fairest. We continue this tradition at **St. Pio** each year with a **Solemn Mass August 15 at 5 p.m. followed by a procession to the beach** when a wreath of flowers will be cast into the sea. Tradition also says that those who step in the waters or take the water home may receive healing graces. I guess I never received that because I wear shoes and the Lavallette lifeguards in the boat make sure that I don't get wet at all as they graciously stay overtime that evening to help us with this devotion.

As a meditation for the day, consider reading and praying the "Hail Star of the Sea" hymn. Regular Holy Day Masses will be offered at 8:30 a.m. and 5:15 p.m. at Sacred Heart, and Mass in Church at St. Pio at 9:30 a.m.





**SAINT
MAXIMILIAN
KOLBE**

St. Maximilian Kolbe was born as Raymund Kolbe on January 8, 1894, in the Kingdom of Poland, part of the Russian Empire. He was a Polish Conventual Franciscan friar and a martyr in the German death Camp of Auschwitz during World War II.

On February 17, 1941, Kolbe was arrested by the German Gestapo and taken to the Pawiak prison. Three months later, he was transferred to Auschwitz. Never abandoning his priesthood, Kolbe was the victim of severe violence and harassment. Toward the end of his second month in Auschwitz, men were chosen to face death by starvation to warn against escapes. Kolbe was not chosen but volunteered to take the place of a man with a family. It is said during the last days of his life Kolbe led prayers to Our Lady with the prisoners and remained calm. He was the last of the group to remain alive, after two weeks of dehydration and starvation. The guards gave him a lethal injection of carbolic acid. The stories tell that he raised his left arm and calmly awaited death. St. Maximilian Kolbe died on August 14 and his remains were cremated on August 15, the same day as the Assumption of Mary feast day.

FAITH AND HOPE

Faith and hope are closely united in today's readings. The Israelites knew when the Passover was coming, and so were not in fear, but had faith and courage, "putting into effect with one accord the divine institution." In this we can see a foretelling of the Eucharist that we celebrate according to Christ's command, "Do this in memory of me."

We see that Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, and Jacob died in faith, although they did not see fulfillment of the promise. We live in hope that our faith will be fulfilled every time we celebrate this sacrament. We too are not to be afraid, but to have hope that our faith will be fulfilled in the coming of Christ.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION



When Pope Pius XII died in 1958, there was the usual buzz of speculation about likely successors. Cardinal Agagianian, Patriarch of the Armenians, was highly thought of as a likely choice. This took many Catholics by surprise, since he had never celebrated

the same liturgy as Pope Pius, but followed ancient Armenian customs according to the Eastern Church, which veils the Eucharistic liturgy from sight by a series of curtains, and in which the priest kneels while the people stand for Communion.

In the years that followed, the Second Vatican Council would affirm the dignity and independence of the Eastern Churches, in complete union with Rome, yet different in patterns of life and worship. We have the same faith, the same sacraments, and the same pope. Yet everywhere in the world our separate Churches are combined into families held together by the ministry of bishops. All of this serves as warning: If you ever say, "But we've always done it this way," you are on very thin ice indeed!




