## 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time August 19th, 2018

**Marriages:** This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

**Baptisms:** The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

**Anointing of the Sick:** This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

## **From Father Doug:**

*“Worship” itself, Eucharistic communion, includes the reality both of being loved and of loving others in turn. A Eucharist which does not pass over into the concrete practice of love is intrinsically fragmented. Conversely, the ‘commandment’ of love is only possible because it is more than a requirement. Love can be ‘commanded’ because it has first been given.” (Deus Caritas Est 14, Benedict XVI)*

The relationship between the Sacrifice of the Mass and what happens in the world through us because of that encounter with Christ cannot be separated. We offer the Holy Mass so that we may be dismissed from Mass, both words which are directly related to the word for mission. That is why Pope Benedict XVI added the dismissal to the new translation of the Roman Missal “Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.” Sometimes sadly the grace of the Sacrament has worn off before the parking lot traffic has cleared at the end of Mass.

A few years ago I had the privilege of preaching a three day retreat for the Missionaries of Charity in Asbury Park. This was in preparation for the Feast of the Queenship of Mary which they celebrate as their Patronal Festival under the title of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, the Cause of our Joy. At that Mass the Sisters renewed their promises to their community, the Church, poverty and an additional one, a vow to serve the poor. Added to the vows are the tenets of the Community. One Mother stressed was “cheerfulness.” They are a cheerful lot.

Mother Teresa was known for caring for the dying, the poor, the hungry, and the lonely and despairing. It is difficult work. What most people don’t know is that they are also one of the most contemplative religious communities. Every morning there is a long period of prayer, frequent Eucharistic Adoration, and most importantly for them, Holy Mass. In every Chapel is a large Crucifix with the words next to it “I thirst.” These words are perhaps the most demanding of us among the seven last words of Jesus in His Passion. For the Sisters it is a reminder that people are thirsting for water, are in need of food, in need of compassion and mercy, in need of someone who will listen without judging, and most of all they are thirsting for Christ. Theirs is a beautiful vocation that relies solely on the support of the faithful, and yet they do not solicit donations, they graciously accept what is given to them, and the list of names for whom they pray at each Mass includes benefactors, and the people of the parish of the priest celebrant of the Mass that day.

The Missionaries of Charity offer as an example for our own lives as well. Are we generous with what God has given us? What do we do to show mercy to those in need? Are we faithful to Holy Mass and mostly are we faithful to the dismissal, to go and glorify the Lord with our lives?

**AUGUST 19, 2018**  
**20TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**  
**THIS EUCHARISTIC FEAST**

Some things about human nature don't change, even over the course of centuries. When we celebrate a holiday, we have a meal; when we celebrate a significant event, we have a feast. In today's first reading, Lady Wisdom is setting a feast, a sign of celebrating the covenant that Israel has with God. Israel's central remembrance of its saving Exodus covenant is the Passover meal. So it is natural—and not coincidental—that the Christian celebration of the new covenant sealed by the blood of Christ on the cross happens at a meal, our Eucharist, offered first by Jesus in the context of Passover remembrance. It is easy for us, sometimes, to forget the very long and rich religious and human origins of our eucharistic feasting on the bread and cup that are the Body and Blood of Jesus. Today, and for the next few Sundays that we hear the "Bread of Life" discourse from John, let us bring to mind the loving covenant that God makes with us, and be filled with great joy at this marvelous feast that we have come to attend!
