



September 2, 2018

Marriages: This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Funerals: Please call the Rectory.

From Father Doug:

This is a tough time of year for many people. It is difficult to see the end of summer, especially for those whose livelihoods depend on the business that they have during a few short months. Others experience what I did as a child, the end of the carefree fun of summer, a very sad thing, but on the day after Labor Day, when we got to about the Driscoll Bridge, excitement for school took over. There are beautiful traditions that mark the end of the official summer season, though locals realize September is actually the best month at the shore. My cats and I do not like fireworks. At all. Ever. If too close we are all under the bed. But there are other traditions like processions of boats at dusk with beautiful lights. Less formal traditions like saying goodbye to friends made, and knowing lives will part. God brings people into to our lives for a time. I remember some of the friends I made during the summer that I would never hear from or see again. And yet some of my memories of them are more vivid and joyous than those with my closest friends growing up.

We are all extraordinarily blessed. It is important to realize and give profound thanks for that. For most people, even in our own country, there is nothing enjoyable about summer. No vacations, just work, and no air conditioning, and traveling about our cities when the heat radiating from the pavement is almost unbearable. Something to think about, and some people to pray for as we walk along the water's edge for the last time this season.

The blessings that God bestows upon us come by no merit of our own, they are freely given by God, but they come with responsibility. We are called to be good stewards with what God has given us. There is tremendous need. Many people are angry with the Church right now, and every day the news gets worse as we realize that the scandal goes to the very top. People have said they will not give any money to the Church until this mess is cleaned up. Our generosity should not be because the Church needs our money. It should be because we have a spiritual need, found throughout scripture to give of our first fruits. There are many Catholic causes, missions, outreach programs, all of these both global and local that need our support. We are called to give to the mission of the Church, something that takes funding to continue, and our spiritual health depends on that generosity. We can give to any Catholic cause that is in keeping with the Magisterium's teaching. That is a matter of personal conscience. It has been a beautiful summer, except on the weekends when mostly it rained. It has been a joy to see our churches both filled at most Masses. I have to say there is a great sense of hope in what really matters to see 700 people at Mass regularly at St. Pio's and eases in daily Mass at both parishes. Blessings on all for these last days of summer, and for many, we look forward to welcoming you back next year.

THE HIGHEST LAW

From time to time, newspapers and magazines will offer, as an item of “filler,” various laws that are still on the books but seem silly to us in our day and age. In one California city, it is illegal to have two indoor bathtubs in one house. Clean water, a precious commodity when the law was written, is now readily available, so the law seems silly. But the human value of protecting and preserving precious resources is still around, evident in many conservation laws that seem sensible to us. So it is with the laws of religious tradition. What Jesus scorns today is others’ attitude toward ritual laws, an attitude that becomes nearly idolatrous when laws are observed for their own sake. Jesus teaches that observation of external ritual laws is of value only when they are emblems of our internal disposition toward the will of God. Our whole lives must follow the one ultimate law of God: to love God completely and to love neighbor entirely. Roman Catholicism is a tradition rich with customs, traditions, and even laws. As we continue to listen to the voice of Christ, we must always look into our own hearts and underneath our ritual practices to make sure that love of God and love of neighbor are what we prize above all.
