



24th Sunday in Ordinary Time September 16th, 2018

Marriages: This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Funerals: Please call the Rectory.

From Father Doug:

A couple of months into our new reality as linked parishes it is a good time for some basic reflections of how it has been and what the plans for the future might hold. Some immediate things have already been a great benefit. Most notably, having a business manager has allowed me to hand over many of the time consuming tasks that a business mind can handle in half the time it takes someone with theology degrees to accomplish.

Some things evolve naturally out of unforeseen factors. Our CCD Coordinator at St. Pio, Dee Deturo, being a new great-grandmother, has decided to retire in order to spend more time in her new role. We thank her for her very good work, and she will be greatly missed. With numbers of students so low at S. Pio, we will be combining the programs next September. John Paglione, CCD Coordinator at Sacred Heart will be overseeing both programs and beginning plans for their combining next year. RCIA will now be done together, and we are looking at what other ministries could easily be combined to provide stronger ministry for both parishes. In order to better assist with this, I will be reconfiguring the Pastoral Councils into what will be a transition team as we explore the future two parishes united in ministry. Decisions will need to be made about coordinating the Mass schedules as we see the number of available clergy declining. With a retired deacon at St. Pio and a borrowed deacon from St. Mary of the Lake, Lakewood, who serves primarily as a musician at Sacred Heart; we are forced to limit weddings to parishioners and those with a connection to the parish. All of the surrounding parishes are better staffed with clergy to cover what we can no longer do well in wedding preparations. We are beginning a true and professionally staffed bereavement group at St. Pio's with details to follow, open, of course, to people of both parishes. We have two adult faith formation programs coming at Sacred Heart. I will be leading a group following Mass on Wednesdays in early October. We will then have a book discussion for women based on how to deepen your life of prayer, which will likely be during Advent.

Aside from the inevitable changes in Mass times the vast majority of parishioners, in both places will continue as if nothing has happened. Not everyone will like some the things that will come to pass. Mostly that you may be joining me in spending a little more time going up and down Route 35. But I am finding with less traffic, and the sun rising as I drive to Bay Head before morning Mass, it is a blessing in the midst of a time of change.

LISTENING AND RESPONDING

There are three interwoven themes in today's readings: listening to God, faith vs. good works, and losing our life in order to find it. How are they related?

The Suffering Servant of Isaiah undergoes much distress and ridicule, but is able to bear it because he has listened to the promptings of God day after day. The psalm tells us that God listens, too. God hears our prayers for help and is always ready to save us. As our faith deepens, so does our desire to do the works of justice and charity that build up the reign of God. God directs our actions in ways we often cannot see, and we don't always see the results. We are called upon in faith to trust that what we do is enough, and that willingness to listen to God's promptings will lead us in the right way.
