



Marriages: This wonderful sacrament is a joyous time, but also a rewarding spiritual journey. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek that you both flourish the second day and beyond. We are happy to accompany you on your journey. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, are required and individual visits with your priest or deacon will also assist you in your preparation. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other details particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend a Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

From Father Doug:

It is a little over a year that I have been Pastor of Sacred Heart Parish. Getting used to a new Pastor is very difficult for a parish, and I am deeply grateful for how you have tried to get used a new leadership style, and all the other things that come from a change in Pastors. I was surprised and delighted when Father Joe was sent to us by the Bishop. Having both of us here offers us more opportunities to make Pastoral visits and to be present for CCD confessions. I realize that Father Michael made some changes before he left in order to make it easier for me. He has been a wonderful support and source of insight for me, and I know for the many of you who developed close relationships with him. Every priest has a different liturgical style, and I think it's a good thing that our priests represent the full spectrum of liturgical and theological points of view. We are also blessed to have a Deacon-information, Dr. Jim Turro. He has and will continue have adult faith formation opportunities, and you will see him present more often assisting at Holy Mass. Almost everyone knows that Pags does a great deal for the parish. He does a wonderful job with our small CCD program, as well as coordinating many of the details of weekday and weekend Masses. As he is assisting me at Solemn liturgies, and weddings and funerals when I preside. I have expanded his responsibilities beyond just CCD, to include liturgical planning and assisting in coordinating lay ministries. There will be no changes to present leadership and scheduling of extraordinary ministries, but he will be bringing everything to me rather than trying to schedule dozens of 15 minute meetings with people. Finally, Marta Barkhausen, our Business Manager has been a tremendous help in catching up with maintenance issues, financial issues, and Canonical issues.





Francis put on the clothes of a poor shepherd and began to preach about God and looked on all people, creatures and things as his brothers and sisters. Pope Innocent III gave him permission to start a new religious order, the **Franciscans**. St. Francis also helped St. Clare to start the order known as **Poor Clares**.

He believed that nature was the mirror of God. He spoke of the sun as "Brother Sun" and the moon as "Sister Moon. St. Francis had a vision of Jesus hanging on the Cross and the marks of the five wounds of Jesus appeared on his hands, side and feet which remained with him all his life.



HOW GOD INTENDS US TO LIVE

Today's readings are again directed to believers, communities of faith. As in last week's reading, Amos confronts us with a condemnation of those whose lives are focused on pleasure and self-absorption. The psalm contrasts that focus with the Lord's—justice for the oppressed; food the hungry; freedom for captives; sight to the blind; raising of those who are bowed down; loving the just; protecting strangers, orphans, and the widow; and by doing so, thwarting the way of the wicked. Timothy urges the pursuit of righteousness, devotion, faith, love, patience, and gentleness. Luke tells the familiar tale of the wealthy man and the poor beggar at his doorstep, who experience life very differently in this world and in the next. We are once again being given clear indications about how God intends for us to live our lives.



TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Over the past century, a desire to recover a deep sense of unity among all believers in Christ has grown. The "ecumenical movement" (from the Greek word meaning the "the whole inhabited world") began among Protestant Christians, but was given great energy in 1920 with a letter from the Orthodox Patriarch of Constantinople, calling for closer dialogue and cooperation among Christians. In 1960, Pope John XXIII invited Protestant and Orthodox observers to the Second Vatican Council. In 1964, the Council's Decree on Ecumenism named these Christians "separated brethren," a huge leap forward from the time of labeling them as "outside the Church." A year later, a new pope, Paul VI, and the Orthodox Patriarch officially nullified the condemnations that walled off East from West for nine hundred years.



The pace and optimism of the 1960s has sadly waned, and the signs of progress toward unity are few; yet there are wider agreements on sharing Communion among various Christian denominations, and among Protestants agreements regarding sharing of ecclesiastical life and ministry. Among the success stories of the ecumenical movement are greater cooperation among Christian clergy, a similar Lectionary for Protestants and Catholics, and even experiments in the monastic life and common worship.
