26th Sunday in Ordinary Time September 30th, 2018

Marriages: This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Funerals: Please call the Rectory.

From Father Doug:

Some people own dogs. Some people even own reptiles as pets and they “love” them. I have an irrational fear of reptiles, or perhaps a Biblical fear of reptiles. Someone I care for deeply was “owned” by her daughter’s rabbit. Sometimes I confess I asked about the rabbit before the daughter. I grew up with dogs. Sadly I was exposed to severe animal abuse at a very early age. Despite that I was allowed by my mother to have hamsters, parakeets, 2 puppies that didn’t work out so well; they had to go to the farm, but they really did, I checked.

When I went to seminary in my loneliness, a dog was impossible. Plastic bag, my hand, midnight street, I was distraught. A “Cat Person” gifted me the book “The Cat who came for Christmas.

From that day I have been blessed with and owned by; Angus (named for Angus Dunn a brilliant scholar, Otto, for St. Otto the crazy, Eugene, because he was a Eugene; and soon was named “Huge-ene” and he died fat and healthy in his and my sleep under my arm. Then was owned by Peter, Paul, and Clancy. When I went to Catholic Seminary there was a no pet policy which the Episcopal Church did not have; perhaps I should have known then. My best friend, a Catholic priest welcomed them.

There are two reasons I share this, and people who don’t like pets, get a heart and next week I won’t talk about pets. There are countless dogs, cats, hamsters, guinea pigs, ferrets, and yes there are people who “love” reptiles, despite the Scriptural evidence to their evil.

Like Moses before him, Jesus corrects his disciples' misunderstanding of the gift of the Spirit.
