## 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time October 7th, 2018

**Marriages:** This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

**Baptisms:** The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

**Anointing of the Sick:** This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

*From Father Doug:*

An anonymous call came in this past week criticizing me for attempting to “turn back the clock.” Actually, as Pope Benedict XVI clearly stated over and over again, we need to restore reverence and dignity to the Holy Mass

Since the reforms that came in the wake of the Second Vatican Council, what is often called “the spirit of Vatican II” much has been lost. Thankfully the faithful are driving a restoration of the transcendence of the timeless liturgy.

One example of change assumed but never stated in the documents is how to receive Holy Communion. The universal norm of the Church is to receive on the tongue. An indult (permission) has been given for communion in the hand in the United States. Kneeling or standing is appropriate. There is certainly something to be said for the reverence that comes with receiving in the “old” way. Now many people come up quickly and receive the Most Holy Eucharist very casually. We teach children in preparation for 1<sup>st</sup> Communion the proper way, but they soon forget. The norm in the United States is to receive standing, but **no one** may be denied the sacrament if they prefer to receive kneeling. (GIRM 160). Before receiving, the communicant makes a sign of reverence, a bow or genuflection, to the Most Holy Eucharist. The priest, deacon or extraordinary minister then says *Corpus Christi* (The Body of Christ). The communicant replies ‘Amen.’ And receives the Sacrament either on the tongue, or where this is allowed and if the communicant so chooses, in the hand. As soon as the communicant receives the host, he or she consumes it immediately.” (GIRM 161). It is important that the Sacred Host be consumed immediately, not after returning to one’s seat because great care must be taken that the Eucharist is not profaned.

Accidents happen. When receiving on the tongue, if the mouth is not open wide enough, or if the tongue is not extended it is difficult to administer communion *on the tongue*. If receiving according to the permission given, on the hand, one hand should be placed *under* the other making a throne for the King as St. Cyril of Jerusalem said many years ago. The lower hand then picks up the sacred host and brings it to the communicant’s mouth. If the host drops simply pick it up quickly and consume it. Receiving our Blessed Lord in the Most Holy Eucharist is the most important gift we have. There is no time when we are closer to God than when we are in His physical presence in the Eucharist and can receive him into ourselves. Every once in a while, it is good to look at how we are doing this, and to be sure we are showing the reverence we intend.



This annual event gives thanks


