



**Marriages:** This wonderful sacrament is a joyous time, but also a rewarding spiritual journey. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek that you both flourish the second day and beyond. We are happy to accompany you on your journey. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, are required and individual visits with your priest or deacon will also assist you in your preparation. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other details particularly reception facilities.

**Baptisms:** The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend a Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

**Anointing of the Sick:** This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.





**From Fr. Joe:**

*We seem to be losing a sense of the sacred in our attitude at Mass and while we are at Church. We see a lot of casualness and chatter. Our attitude should be one of reverence and prayer. Do we realize we are in the very presence of God? Let us not ignore Him in his own house. Many people seem all too eager to receive the Eucharist and walk right out the door. This is like being a guest at a dinner party, getting up and leaving after the main course without saying thank you.*

*After Eucharist is a time when we have Christ right within us: body, blood, soul and divinity. It is a time of prayer and thanksgiving. A time when we enter into a dialogue with Christ in our heart, and expressing our love for Jesus and thanks for the blessings he has given us.*

*The sacrament of confession is an especially good way to prepare for receiving communion at Mass. It is like cleaning our house and preparing for a special guest: when it is clean we feel good, we feel ready. We have prepared our soul, we are ready to receive God. Remember the feeling we get after absolution: the feeling of peace, of freedom, of release. The cleanliness of our soul. Receiving the Eucharist unworthily is in itself a grave sin we must avoid.*

*We need to recapture a spirit of holiness and reverence and not suffer the consequences that we see in our abandonment and neglect of God. There are many prayers of Thanksgiving after we receive communion, if we are at a loss for words. The prayer below is one of them.*

### **Prayer of Thanksgiving after Communion**

**Jesus Christ, son of God, Savior**

**As I am united with you in body and spirit, in this Eucharist**

**May my heart burn with deep love for you and for our Father.**

**By the Power of your Holy Spirit, burn away all evil and temptation, make my heart pure and increase my faith, hope and charity.**

**Let your will be known to me; give me the courage to do as you ask, and let me feel and know the healing, joy and peace of our love.**



## SAINT TERESA OF AVILA



*Born in Spain on March 28th, 1515 to noble parents. When very young Teresa became crippled by disease and unable to walk, she prayed to St. Joseph, who cured her. St. Teresa was a Carmelite nun, mystic, religious reformer, author, theologian of the contemplative life and metal prayer.*

*St. Teresa is also known for her raptures which involved levitation, which was a source of embarrassment to her. By a life of constant prayer, Teresa brought many souls to Jesus. On October 4, 1582, Jesus appeared to Teresa, who begged Him to take her to Himself. After her prayer, her soul was taken to heaven.*

*Nine months after her death she was found to be totally intact. Although her clothes had decayed, she smelled sweet. She was canonized by Pope Gregory XV in 1622.*

## SAINT LUKE

*Luke was a Greek born in Antioch, Syria and was a physician. Luke was one earliest converts to the Faith. He became a missionary companion of St. Paul and attended Paul during his imprisonment. From Paul's Epistles we learn that Luke was his faithful companion to his end.*

*Luke is the author of the third Gospel, written in the year 63. He also wrote the Acts of the Apostles. His symbol is the ox, the animal of sacrifice because this Gospel begins with the history of Zachary the priest, offering sacrifice to Gods He also wrote about St. Paul's actions and miracles which he witnessed.*

*Patron of Painters, Physicians, bachelors, surgeons, farmers, artists.*

## SAINT HEDWIG



*Duchess and widow, the patroness of Silesia, a region of eastern Europe. Also called Jadwiga in some lists, she died in a Cistercain convent, having taken vows. Hedwig was born in Bavaria, Germany, the daughter of the Duke of Croatia and Dalmatia. She was the aunt of St. Elizabeth of Hungary. At the age of twelve, Hedwig was married to Duke Henry of Silesia, the head of the Polish Royal family. She bore him seven children, and they had a happy marriage. When Henry died in 1238 and Hedwig became a Cistercain at Trebnitz. She had to leave her prayers to make peace among her offspring, and she buried a child who was killed fighting against the Mongols. She died in the convent on October 15. Many miracles were reported after her death, and she was canonized in 1266.*

*All powerful God, may the prayers of St. Hedwig bring us your help and may her life of remarkable humility be an example to us all. We ask this through our Lord Jesus Christ, Your Son who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.*

## SAINT GERARD MAJELLA

*Gerard was born in Italy on April 23, 1726. His father, a tailor, died when Gerard was twelve leaving his family in poverty. He was accepted by the Redemptorists as a lay brother and served as a sacristan, gardener, porter, infirmarian and tailor. Gerard was called the “wonder-worker” because of many miraculous things that happened through his intercession. He suffered in silence when falsely accused of immoral conduct by an evil woman who later confessed her lie. He also helped a woman on the verge of childbirth. He is the patron of expectant mothers, children, unborn children, women in childbirth, motherhood, falsely accused people, good confessions, lay brothers and Muro Lucano, Italy. He died of tuberculosis at the age of twenty-nine. He was canonized by Pope St. Pius X.*



**28TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**  
**OCTOBER 13, 2019**

**HEALING AND SALVATION**

The readings today speak of healing and salvation. In Second Kings, Naaman, a commander of the army of the king of Syria, develops leprosy. He goes to a stranger, a prophet from Israel, when no one else can cure his disease. Much to his surprise, after a simple bath in the river, he is cured. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus cures ten lepers and sends them to the priest. Only one, a Samaritan, returns to thank Jesus for his cure and only he hears the words, "Your faith has saved you." The psalm and Timothy remind us that salvation involves justice, kindness, and faithfulness and forever links us with Jesus. In a world as broken as ours, both healing and salvation are necessary.



**TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION**

Christian liturgy has always contained an opportunity to make a choice for sharing. From the beginning, Christians pooled their resources, especially for the care of widows and orphans, at the weekly Eucharist. Over the years, the collection became detached from the liturgy and baskets or plates would be passed through the community while the Mass was going on at the altar, or contributions would be collected at the doors. In Milan's Ambrosian Rite, these gifts have always been brought to the altar by lay people in procession. In German countries, the ancient custom was for the entire assembly to process with their gifts—first the men, then the women, then the priests and deacons—to offer their gifts at the altar. The old ceremony of canonization included a curious vestige of this procession: people would present the pope with two loaves of bread, two barrels of wine and water, five candles, and three cages containing pigeons or turtledoves!
