



## 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time October 28th, 2018

**Marriages:** This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

**Baptisms:** The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

**Anointing of the Sick:** This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

**Funerals:** Please call the Rectory.



**From Father Doug:**

All Saints and All Souls Days are among my favorite days in the church year. They mark for us two sides of the coin of what awaits all of us. No one likes to think about mortality, but we should. In fact, with the horror movies, the violence that we seem to find entertaining and the whole very peculiar tradition of Halloween, which I find disturbing; all this has made us turn death into something fearful and horrible. That is very far from the Christian understanding. All Souls Day reminds us that we will all one day go to God, and what awaits us there will depend largely on how we live here.

Recently I overheard a conversation where purgatory was mentioned. The response was “we don’t have purgatory, anymore do we?” I don’t believe purgatory was relocated at Vatican II. All Souls Day is a time to pray for all those who are preparing to be ready for heaven. Many of these, we believe, are those who denied God, or who lived consciously aware that they were living contrary to his will. But no one is beyond the reach of God’s forgiveness. Most of us will die with some stains on our souls. Purgatory is a great gift, a time to prepare for the glories of heaven. We pray for the dead in hopes that God will find them ready for heaven. I find that very comforting. That there is a chance that we can still grow readier for God. Many in other ecclesial communities believe that at the moment of death heaven or hell are the only alternatives. They do not pray for the dead. Even at funerals, they give thanks for the life, pray for the family, but never pray for the dead. They don’t believe it would have any effect. We do. And so we pray for the dead who are preparing for heaven.


All Saints’ Day reminds us of the countless number of those who lived holy and saintly lives, and in a way, did it right; that is, without drawing attention to themselves. Not to lessen the glory and achievement of the canonized saints, those recognized and honored to the glories of the altar. All Saints Day gives us the chance to honor those who don’t have their own day. Some of them could be people we also remember on All Souls Day. But the emphasis is different. One day we pray for those we know and loved here on earth; while the other is a day to honor people of exceptional holiness.

All Souls’ evening, we will all gather at 5 p.m. at St. Pio Church to remember those from both of our parishes who have died in the last year, and also to remember and most importantly pray for our departed dear ones. Some of their deaths were tragic, when death came suddenly and unexpectedly, even in a very untimely way for some. Others were people for whom death came as a welcome friend, for those ready for the next step, never easy for those who grieve, but for those going to God it can be a beautiful thing. All these people were held dear, and now they live on, preparing to be with God. And so we come together to remember them, to pray for them, and to thank God for them. And we also know, and should be very grateful that they too are praying for us.

### **ALL SAINTS PRAYER**

*Dear God,* thank you for the example of the Saints. I desire to join in their company, worshipping you forever in Heaven. Please help me follow their footsteps, and yours, Jesus Christ. Please help me to conform myself to Your image, seeking Your will in all things, as the Saints did. Please help me to devote myself, and all that I do, to Your glory, and to the service of my neighbors. Amen.



**THE HOPE AND PROMISE OF REDEMPTION**

The prophet Jeremiah prophesies the end of the Babylonian exile. He describes how the weak and sorrowful people now return with joy. These are the scattered people of God: the blind and the lame, the mothers and pregnant women. They shall be led along an easy road so that no one will stumble. The Lord's kindness and mercy are on all these weak and broken people.

Here and in Psalm 126 we find the most lovely poetic images of God's love and care for us. "Those that sow in tears / shall reap rejoicing. Although they go forth weeping, / carrying the seed to be sown, / they shall come back rejoicing, / carrying their sheaves" (Psalm 126:5-6). Although God had to punish Israel for their many sins, God never forgot them, scattered as they were, and brings them all back to the land of their ancestors, there to flourish and be joyful again. We can see in this the hope and the promise of our own redemption, gathered from the far corners of the earth into the great banquet of God.
