



32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time November 11, 2018

Marriages: This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Funerals: Please call the Rectory.



From Father Doug:

Sometimes we need an attitude adjustment, or at least I do. Sometimes our less than pleasant selves can be caught up short by a song we hear that brings us back to another time. Sometimes it can be a smell that we sense that transports us immediately to a different place and time. Call it what you like, I believe it is the Holy Spirit.

This painting is, well obviously, my favorite one of Pope Benedict. Say what you will, I believe he is the example of humility. A timid scholar, the perfect number two man for a saintly pope. Then thrust at a very advanced age into a job he neither wanted nor expected. For someone who took liturgy and proper dress and decorum very seriously, he would not have been wearing an old black sweater under his cassock if he thought in a few moments he would step onto the world stage as the Vicar of Christ with his sweater sleeves hanging out. Of course very few noticed that, but it was the first thing I noticed, and it showed the humility of a man that few would acknowledge.



My attitude adjustment came when looking at this painting which I see every day it suddenly prompted me to find my pictures from the Beatification of Blessed John Henry Cardinal Newman when I stood about three feet from him in the beginning of Holy Mass. We didn't "meet", the Mass had begun and he was standing there waiting for the procession's traffic to break. We did briefly lock eyes for a moment. And in that instant everything made sense: my beliefs, my love for that Pope, my devotion to St. Elizabeth Ann Seton the first Anglican Convert and Newman the most famous. It was also a much happier time in the Church than right now.

We can't let the media or the corruption of the Bishops and the Vatican determine our relationship with God and His Church. They are not His Church, at least not entirely. Gathering on a sunny afternoon with beloved pets, that's the Church. A lovely evening of remembering and healing when we remembered those who have died this past year, that is the Church. The baptisms, the weddings, and the funerals that happen week after week, that is the Church, and most of all the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered every day, that is the Church.

A brief journey in my mind back to a field in Birmingham, England did wonders for my discouragement. Thanks be to God!

THE CALL TO DISCIPLESHIP

The core vocation in the Gospel of Mark is the vocation, or call, to discipleship. Today's Gospel passage provides us with one last example of what the vocation to discipleship means, and one example of what it doesn't mean. A destitute widow shows us that discipleship means following Jesus' way of service, even if it requires giving one's livelihood (or life). The scribes show us by their bad example that discipleship should entail a vocation to extend God's care to those who are most in need.

In our reading from the book of Kings another widow and her son are close to death. They too give what little they have, but they are rewarded by Elijah with food enough for a year. And the reading from the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that Jesus sacrificed his life "to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him" (Hebrews 9:28).



The LORD keeps faith forever, secures justice for the oppressed, gives food to the hungry.
— *Psalm 146:7*

TODAY'S READINGS

First Reading — The widow of Zarephath had only a handful of flour and a little oil, but made a little cake for Elijah (1 Kings 17:10-16).

Psalm — Praise the Lord, my soul! (Psalm 146).

Second Reading — Christ will appear a second time to bring salvation to those who eagerly await him (Hebrews 9:24-28).

Gospel — This poor widow put in more than all the other contributors (Mark 12:38-44 [41-44]).
