Marriages: This great sacrament of vocation is a joyous time, but also a time of very serious spiritual preparation. The responsibility assumed by the couple and the Church is significant. While many focus on the day of the wedding, we seek to prepare for the second day and beyond. The Bishops of NJ have adopted a policy to assist in this preparation. Attendance at Engaged Encounter, Pre-Cana, or another approved marriage prep program, and individual sessions with a priest or deacon are required of all couples. Couples should contact the Rectory one year in advance of the intended marriage, and before finalizing other detail particularly reception facilities.

Baptisms: The Church shares the joy of families in the birth of children, and, with their parents takes seriously the responsibility of bringing them up in the faith. Parents seeking baptism for their children are to attend Baptismal Prep Class. This can be arranged by calling the parish office. Parents should be registered members of the parish. Godparents, those who represent the church in the life of the child, must be practicing Catholics, if they are married, they must have been married in the Church, practice the faith regularly, and must obtain a sponsor certificate from their home parish. Please choose Godparents with these criteria in mind.

Anointing of the Sick: This sacrament is given for those facing serious illness or surgery, and for those of advanced years. If you or a family member is planning to enter the hospital, please see one of the priests following Mass or call the rectory if you would like to receive this sacrament.

Funerals: Please call the Rectory.

From Father Doug:

A few weeks ago at a children's Mass I asked why the young people don't like to go to Mass. I knew what their answer would be. They are very predictable. In chorus they responded, "It's boring." I have heard that response before, and not just from young people. When I was officiating at Confirmation liturgies as Vicar of Education, I heard that response at every parish I visited.

People today expect to be entertained constantly. Visual stimulation, the constant clamor of what some people today call "music", and the overstimulation of video games. As I have thought about this through the years I have come to realize that people respond that Mass is boring for the same reason I have never been able to sit through an entire game of any sport. I know I am in the minority because I would respond to the question "why don't you watch any sports?" with the same answer, "It's boring." Somewhere along the way I realized that I have devoted my entire education to studying the worship of the Church, but I have no idea in the world what happens in a football game. Many people don't engage in Mass because they don't know what is happening, what it all means, the symbolism behind every word, gesture, color, smell, and sound. Much of that is the fault of the Church because we have been very poorly educating the faithful for about 50 years. Venerable Pope Pius XII wrote an encyclical in 1947 that would be the basis for the document on the Sacred Liturgy of Vatican II in 1963. He first used the phrase *participatio actuosa*. This became the battle cry after the Council. Everyone must be "actively participating" at every Mass. The words don't really mean being busy, active, they mean being engaged, having actual participation in Mass.

In order to engage more actually in the Liturgy, on Wednesdays at Sacred Heart Church following the morning Mass beginning at 9:30 in the Parish Center I will be leading a book discussion centered on the book *A Devotional Journey into the Mass: How Mass can become a Time of Grace, Nourishment, and Devotion*. We will begin on Wednesday, December 5 and continue December 12 and 19, and January 8 and 15. Books are available in church or at the parish office. This is a great way to enter more fully into the most important experience we have of God, when we meet Him in Holy Mass.
